


## MACROECONOMIC ANALYSIS MEXICO: Consumer Price Index during the first half of April

The INEGI published this Thursday the National Consumer Price Index (INPC) and registered a variation of 6.05% at an annual rate for the first half of March (4.12% in the first half of March).

The underlying price index, which is one that excludes products with high price volatility from its accounting, had an annual variation of 4.13%. (4.09% in the first half of March).

The non-underlying price index, which accounts for products with high price volatility, presented an annual variation of 12.21%. (4.19% in the first half of March).

The products that had the greatest variation in their prices during the first half of April were serrano pepper (25.13%), tomato (18.84%) and avocado (15.74%)

The National Consumer Price Index (INPC) registered its highest level since the second half of December 2017, when it stood at 6.85%. The increase in inflation due to an accelerated increase in energy prices.

The market expected that in April of this year inflation could reach these levels, not only due to a recovery in energy prices, but also due to a base effect of comparison. Last year, with the onset of the pandemic, inflation registered a level of 2.08% in the first half of April.
